USS S-28 (SS-133)

Lost on July 4, 1944 with the loss of 49 crew members. She was conducting training exercises off Hawaii with the US Coast Guard Cutter Reliance.



After S-28 dove for a practice torpedo approach, Reliance lost contact. No distress signal or explosion was heard. Two days later, an oil slick was found near where S-28. The exact cause of her loss remains a mystery.



USS Robalo (SS-273)

Lost on July 26, 1944 with the loss of 81 crew members while on her 3rd war patrol. She struck a mine about 2 miles off the coast of Palawan. Four men survived and swam ashore, then were imprisoned by



the Japanese. Unfortunately, they were put on a Japanese destroyer and lost when that destroyer was sunk.



USS Grunion (SS-216)

Lost on July 30, 1942 with the loss of 70 crew members while on her first war patrol near Kiska Harbor. She radioed that she sank two subchasers and damaged a third, but was never heard from again. Grunion's mangled remains were found in the Bering Sea in 2006 off the Aleutian Island of Kiska.

USSVI NATIONAL CONVENTION

Orlando, Florida September 1 – September 6, 2017 USSVI Central Florida Base is your host for the 2017 USSVI National Convention **2017 USSVI National Convention in Orlando, Florida** Rosen Shingle Creek Hotel and Convention Registration can be done on line "<u>www.ussviconvention.org/2017/</u>" Click on the "Hotel Registration" or "Convention Registration"

We are rapidly approaching the cut-off date for making hotel reservations at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, Florida. To date we have met only 54% of our Room Night Guarantee and as of the 27th of July we will have to reduce the Room Block or be liable for several thousands of dollars in unoccupied rooms. We will also face loses in our food and beverage guarantees should we not meet the minimums contracted.

If you are planning on attending the convention, we need you to make both your hotel and convention reservations as soon as possible in order to get the convention rate of \$105 a night and still be able to make reservations for the luncheons and/or banquets. If we have to reduce the contractual blocks and minimums to reduce our potential loses, before you make your reservations, you will face much higher room rates and the probability of sold out events. As of June 26th only 122 members and 78 guests have been registered. With nearly 13,000 members this is very low and jeopardizes not only this convention, but conventions in the future since convention hotels look at the actual room nights used in previous conventions before they quote a rate. The fewer attending the higher the room rates for future conventions.

I know we all like to wait until the last minute to make reservations and commit our money for a convention and I am one of the worst offenders, however, the time to make your reservations is now. We are really looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible and having a great convention.

The Plight of USS Ling (SS-297), a World War

II-era submarine owned by the Submarine Memorial Association which runs the New Jersey Naval Museum in Hackensack, New Jersey. Mired in the muddy bottom of the Hackensack River and damaged by Hurricane Sandy, Ling became inaccessible to the public and sadly, the museum was forced to close in 2012. Without the revenues, the museum generated from admission fees and charitable donations, the Submarine Memorial Association does not have the funds to move her or to re-



store her. Now, not only has the boat fallen into a serious state of disrepair, she is in danger of being evicted from the berth she has occupied since the early 1970s to make room for a large real estate development project. The Last Ride on the Kamehameha A Sea Story by Howard Grover

Lila and I knew we were committed to this adventure when we made airline and hotel reservations in the middle of June. We left on August 6th and returned the 12th. We also helped many others find hotels especially those Navy retirees who didn't know about the military hotel Hale Koa in Waikiki.

I contacted my Hawaiian cousin a Kamehameha school teacher. She was going to be on another island on the 8th. I didn't know she told the officials at the school about the ceremony. So when we arrived at our hotel there were several messages on the phone. One of those messages was from the school saying the Director of the School Board, Ret. Vice Admiral Robert Ki'hune, would be attending. I called the school and asked if the Navy knew about this. She didn't know. My next call was to the Kam and asked if they knew. The answer was yes.

I promised Capt. Holwolf I would bring the checks I had collected for the reunion dinner on the 7th. So that morning we took a bus to the Bowfin. I met on the bus one the Kam ride helpers who had made up name tags for all of us. The rest of the day was mostly talking with most of guys and their wives who were there. Most of the helpers and organizers had dinner at Bubba Gump's that night.

The 8th our driver took us to Pearl at pier C. The first thing I did was take the few invitations and postage I hadn't used to the XO on board. Then to the covered area where the chairs were set up on the pier. I looked at the front row seat tags. Number 1 was Admiral Fargo COMPACFLT, the 2nd was Vice Admiral Robert Ku'hune, the 3rd was COMSUBPAC and several seats down the row was Capt. Dickieson our first Gold Crew CO.

It wasn't long before LT Donohue (PAO) asked me and Ray Binns to follow him. He introduced us to a reporter for Honolulu Star Bulletin. Some of our comments actually got in the next day paper. I was also interviewed by a local TV Station and a Navy interviewer. I was totally unaware that I might be interviewed but because I was so jazzed about being there it went okay. One of our attendees went to the TV stations and got copies of everything they did that day. I still have that VHS tape.

I was at the edge of the crowd before the ceremony when an older gentleman come up to me wearing a Hawaiian shirt and said to me; "Howard, I am Bob Ki'hune". We had short conversation about the Kamehameha School and my cousin whose comments to the school officials brought him to the ceremony. I also showed him my Kamehameha School Patch on my vest. WOW it isn't every day you get to have an Admiral introduce himself to you.
