




Lost Boats

September

USS S-5 (SS-110)

Lost on September 1, 1920 when a practice dive went wrong and she sank bow-first, with her stern showing above the water. In a dramatic adventure, her exhausted crew was rescued during the next few days. Salvage attempts were unsuccessful, 5 settled to the bottom and was abandoned.



USS Grayling (SS-209)

Lost on Sept 9, 1943 with the loss of 76 men near the Tablas Strait. Grayling was on her 8th war patrol and sank two ships before being lost





USS Pompano (SS-181)

Pompano was sunk with the loss of 77 men while on her 7th war patrol. On Sept 17, 1943. Japanese records show that a submarine was sunk in her patrol area by air & depth charge attack off the Aomori Prefecture near Shiriya Zaki. Before being lost, she sank two enemy cargo ships. The exact cause of her loss remains unknown, but she probably was sunk by the air/sea attack above or fell victim to a mine on or





after 9/25/1943. This boat's last recorded ship (Taiko Maru) sunk happened on Sept 25th, so she probably hit a mine on or after that date but before Oct 5th, when she was scheduled back at Midway.

USS S-51 (SS-162)

Lost on Sept 25, 1925 with the loss of 33 men when it was sunk after collision with SS City of Rome off Block Island.



USS Cisco (SS-290)


Lost on Sept 28, 1943 on her first war patrol with the loss of 76 men in the Sulu Sea west of Mindinao.



Hearing Loss and Tinnitus

What Is Tinnitus?

Tinnitus is usually a symptom of noise-induced hearing loss. It typically manifests itself as a ringing in the ear, although it can sound like clicking, popping, snapping or whistling. One of the causes of tinnitus is damage to the nerves of the inner ear. If damaged enough, the nerves can become bent and constantly register sound input as they will be making continuous contact with the other hairs of the ear. In other cases, tinnitus can be caused by a tumor in the ear which allows the ear to hear the blood passing through the tumor.

How Is Hearing Loss Treated?

Sadly, most cases of hearing loss cannot be treated. When it is a symptom of a larger ailment, hearing loss can be recovered when the disease is treated. With noise-induced hearing loss or head trauma, the damage is usually permanent; however, technology has made it possible to compensate for hearing loss. A hearing aid can be used to mimic the outer and middle ear if they are damaged. For the cochlea (inner ear), a cochlear implant can mimic the nerves that are damaged and relay sound to the brain.

What Can I Do If I Suffer From Hearing Loss?

Veterans who have experienced hearing loss or suffer from tinnitus should contact their local County Veteran Service Office to evaluate whether to file a claim for VA compensation. If awarded a disability rating, the veteran may be eligible for monthly compensation and hearing aids, repairs, and future batteries could all be provided at no charge.

The online voting booth on the USSVI website opened on August 1st and will remain open until October 10th. By now, everyone should have received a copy of their hard-copy issue of the American Submariner (Volume 2018, 2nd Quarter) unless you opted out and receive it online.



Contained therein, starting on page 26 thru 40 you'll find the USSVI National Election documents including biographies of candidates, and instructions (interspersed with some ad copy), and on page 41 the actual ballot. This year, there is only one candidate for each elected officer position, and you can vote only for the Regional Director in the region your Primary Base is located.

There is also a voting box to approve the Proposed Revised USSVI Constitution and Bylaws (CBL) which, as you should be aware, has been combined into one document. If a shipmate requests to re-examine the Proposed Revised USSVI CBL, the document is available on the USSVI website. There is no need to log in, simply go to this link https://www.ussvi.org/Documents/

Online Organization 2018 USSVI REVISED CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS.pdf or go to www.ussvi.org find the gold links on the left side of the page and click on the item titled "Documents" then click on the blue bar titled "Organization". It appears (on my screen) in the middle of the page and has been there since 6/10/2018.

It is important that each shipmate be afforded the opportunity and encouraged to vote, even if there is only one candidate for each position. You vote demonstrates your commitment to the organization and to the leadership who will guide it over the next two years. As the American Submariner has the paper ballot to be cut out, mark your votes, then folded for mailing (you need to add a stamp).



We remember John McCain as a Naval Officer, a Vietnam Veteran and a POW, for those achievements alone he deserves our respect and the condolences of our membership.
