



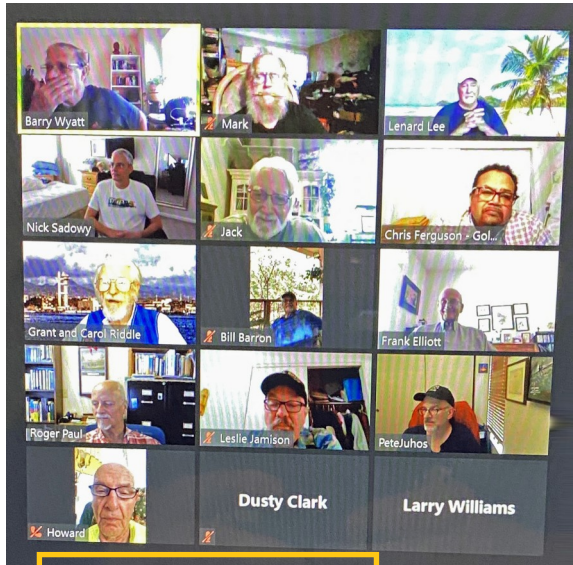

Lost Boats

August

USS Bullhead (SS-332)

Lost on August 6, 1945 with the loss of 84 crew members in the Lombok Strait while on her 3rd war patrol when sunk by a depth charge dropped by a Japanese Army plane. Bullhead was the last submarine lost during WWII.



USS Flier (SS-250) Lost on August 13, 1944, with the loss of 78 crew members while on her 2nd war patrol. Flier was transiting on the surface when she was rocked by a massive explosion (probably a mine) and sank within less than a minute. 13 survivors, some injured, made it into the water and swam to shore. 8 survived and 6 days



USS S-39 (SS-144)

Lost on August 13, 1942 after grounding on a reef south of Rossel Island while on her 3rd war patrol. The entire crew was able to get off and rescued by the HMAS Katoomba.



USS Harder (SS-257)

Lost on August 24, 1944 with the loss of 79 crew members from a depth charge attack by a minesweeper near Bataan while on her 6th war patrol. Harder had won a Presidential Unit Citation for her first 5 war patrols and CDR Dealey was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor posthumously. Harder is tied for 9th in the number of enemy ships sunk.



USS Cochino (SS-345)

Lost on August 26, 1949 after being jolted by a violent polar gale off Norway caused an electrical fire and battery explosion that generated hydrogen and chlorine gasses. In extremely bad weather, men of Cochino and Tusk (SS-426) fought to save the submarine for 14 hours. After a 2nd battery explosion, Abandon Ship was ordered and Cochino sank. Tusk's crew rescued all of Cochino's men except for one civilian engineer. Six sailors from Tusk were lost during the rescue.



Lost Boats

September

USS S-5 (SS-110)

Lost on September 1, 1920 when a practice dive went wrong and she sank bow-first, with her stern showing above the water. In a dramatic adventure, her exhausted crew was rescued during the next few days. Salvage attempts were unsuccessful, S-5 settled to the bottom and was abandoned.

USS Grayling (SS-209)

Lost on Sept 9, 1943 with the loss of 76 men near the Tablas Strait. Grayling was on her 8th war patrol and sank two ships before being lost



USS Pompano (SS-181)

Pompano was sunk with the loss of 77 men while on her 7th war patrol. On Sept 17, 1943. Japanese records show that a submarine was sunk in her patrol area by air & depth charge attack off the Aomori Prefecture near Shiriya Zaki. Before being lost, she sank two enemy cargo ships. The exact cause of her loss remains unknown, but she probably was sunk by the air/sea attack above or fell victim to a mine on or after 9/25/1943. This boat's last recorded ship (Taiko Maru) sunk happened on Sept 25th, so she probably hit a mine on or after that date but before Oct 5th, when she was scheduled back at Midway.



USS S-51 (SS-162)

Lost on Sept 25, 1925 with the loss of 33 men when it was sunk after collision with SS City of Rome off Block Island.



USS Cisco (SS-290)

Lost on Sept 28, 1943 on her first war patrol with the loss of 76 men in the Sulu Sea west of Mindinao.

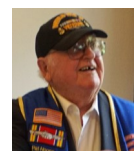

FORMAL REPORTS:

Barry made a motion to "Change the order of the Day" to allow the presentation of USSVI National Awards by District Commander Pete Juhos. The motion passed with no objections. Commander Juhos presented the awards.

Les Jamison was received the Silver Anchor Award. Barry Nominated Les for the award.

Barry Received the Robert Link National Commander's Award. Barry was nominated by Mark.

Barry also received a Meritorious Award. He was nominated for this award by Pete.

BASE COMMANDER: Barry Wyatt The Folsom Veteran's Day Parade Committee held an online meeting during the second week of August and will likely hold another meeting in September. Possible themes for the parade include the 45th Anniversary of the Vietnam War or the 75th Anniversary of World War II. GOLD COUNTRY BASE BYLAWS

ARTICLE X - OFFICERS

Section 1 **ELECTED**

- A. Elected Base Officers shall include the following: Base Commander, Vice Commander, Base Secretary, and Base Treasurer.
- B. The prerequisite for an elected Base Officer is that a Candidate must be a Primary Member in good standing with a minimum of twelve (12) consecutive months active participation in Base meetings and activities. Departure from this requirement requires a vote of the Gold Country Base Executive Board.
- C. The term of office for Base Commander, Vice Commander, Base Secretary, and Base Treasurer will be two (2) years, or until their successors have been elected. The Base Commander and Base Secretary will be elected in even-number ending years; Vice Commander and Base Treasurer will be elected in odd-number ending years. Officers elected outside of their normal election cycle / periodicity will incur the additional time to meet / achieve the normal cycle timeline.
- D. Elected Officers unable to serve their full term due to hardship, health, or incapacity and are able to do so, must communicate their intent of resignation in advance to the Base Commander. Vacancies of elected officers will be as directed by Article XI, Section 3 of these Bylaws
- E. The offices of Base Secretary and Base Treasurer may be held by the same Primary Regular Base member.
- F. Associate Members *may* be elected to fill the offices of Base Secretary and/or Base Treasurer, or any appointed position. An Associate Member Candidate bears the same prerequisites as that of a Primary Regular Member. An Associate Member *may not* be elected as Base Commander and/or Vice Base Commander.
- G. No elected Officer shall be paid for services rendered on behalf of the Base.
- H. Nominations for elected Base Officers shall be submitted at the September Business Meeting. Voting shall be completed at the October meeting; followed by "Installation of Officers" at the following January meeting. Terms for elected Base Officers shall be effective on 1 January of each term. Any modification of the Base Officers nomination and installation process requires approval by vote of the membership.



Tim Spoon Achievement Award Nomination

The Tim Spoon Achievement award is presented to a Gold Country Base crewmember who meets the following requirements;

Nominees will be members in good standing; who have, by his or her personal individual effort and participation during the preceding year (or years) have demonstrably contributed to the advancement and embodiment of the Gold Country Base, and the USSVI creed and purposes; by his or her dedicated service and support to the same, and to his or her fellow submarine veterans and associated members exemplifying the meaning and spirit of the word "Shipmate."

Factors to be considered in nominating and assessing members for the Tim Spoon Achievement award must take into consideration their demonstrable achievement in:

Good Character. Provides a 'model' for others based on personal involvement in Base activities, including attracting and mentoring new members.

Required due paid on time; attends regularly scheduled Base meetings.

Performed assigned duties in such a manner as to positively reflect on the Gold Country Base, and USSVI, with the general public.

Performed one or more specific difficult tasks in the minds of the membership which are considered 'above and beyond.'

Shipmates,

Disregard the previous notice sent out on Saturday September 5, 2020 to include the USS Bonefish SS-582 to the Lost Boats Tolling Ceremony. Due to membership request, the BOD's voted on Wednesday September 8, 2020 to remove/rescind the previous vote taken that resulted in the addition of the Bonefish to the Tolling Ceremony.



The addition of the Bonefish to the Tolling Ceremony was a result of a member(s) asking the BOD's to add an agenda item to our 2020 Annual Post-BOD Meeting to consider including the USS Bonefish SS-582 in the Lost Boats Tolling Ceremony.

This request was complied with and after a discussion which included the details of the catastrophic event that resulted in the loss of three crew members and the eventual scrapping of the Bonefish, the request was approved by a unanimous vote.

Unfortunately, including the Bonefish to the Tolling Ceremony was not accepted very well by a good number of our USSVI members. Their interpretation of the criteria that is to be used in adding a Boat to the Lost Boats listing was not on the same wavelength that the BOD's was using when the vote was taken, this resulted in some very unhappy shipmates. To them, the sanctity of the Lost Boats Tolling Ceremony is not to be taken lightly. They will not split hairs on the definition of a boat being lost, it has to be lost at sea ("Sunk"), period. Returning to port, being decommissioned, and scrapped is not considered as a loss.

The current Tolling Ceremony recognizes, and a bell is rung for all of our shipmates that have been lost where the Boat itself was not lost.

Quote from the Tolling agenda.

"Throughout the history of our Submarine Force, there have been many accidents and casualties which did not directly result in the loss of the boat, but in which Submariners died performing their duties: some were lost individually, and some with their Shipmates, some at-sea and some in-port. We honor and remember all of them here today."

Our BOD's are obligated to immediately reconsider any change they have implemented that causes a major disruption in our membership, weight both sides of the argument, and take the necessary steps to rectify it when needed. This was done and resulted in the addition of the Bonefish to the Tolling Ceremony being rescinded.

As a closing note, the P&P Manual is presently being revised and updated, which will include a rewrite of the criteria addressing the addition of Boats to our Lost Boats Ceremony. The possibility of a difference in interpretation will be eliminated. All the best and please take care, **Wayne Standerfer, National Commander**

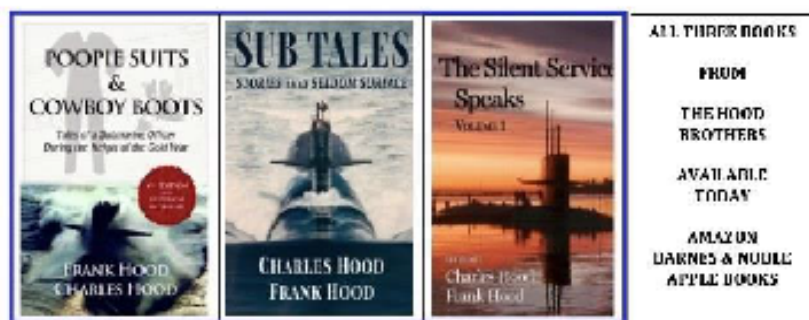

Satellite image of Aug. 18, 2020 appears to show a Chinese submarine using an underground base on Hainan Island on the South China Sea.

Military watchers across the internet were provided with a rare sight after photos circulated this week that appear to show a Chinese submarine using an underground base on Hainan Island on the South China Sea.

The satellite image from American imaging company Planet Labs, first posted on the social media accounts of Radio Free Asia, shows what appears to be a Type 093 nuclear-powered attack submarine entering a tunnel to an underground berth on Yulin Naval Base.

Drew Thompson, a former United States Defense Department official now at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy at the National University of Singapore, says the shot of the submarine is a rare occurrence.



"That's unusual that a commercial satellite would be overhead at just the right time" on a cloudless day, he said.

What's not unusual is the Chinese underground base. It's how Beijing conceals a lot of its military hardware, from submarines to missile systems based far inland, Thompson said.

"The Chinese have tremendous experience building underground facilities," Thompson said. "It's in keeping with their strategic culture."

But the Chinese shorelines get particular attention. "They have an ingrained sense of the acute vulnerability of their coastline to attack," Thompson said.

CNN has reached out to Chinese authorities for comment on the images.

The Yulin base, on the southern end of Hainan Island almost 300 miles (470 kilometers) southwest of Hong Kong, is one of China's key facilities to protect its naval assets.

As for the submarine, Thompson said its presence at the base doesn't send any particular signal about the People's Liberation Army Navy.

"The bottom line is they have a large and growing submarine fleet which is improving in quality," he said. "They are able to protect it with underground facilities." and keep the submarines out the sight of prying eyes.

At least once this year, on May 15, the US Navy sent one of its P-8A Poseidon intelligence and reconnaissance jets on a flight near the Yulin base, Navy spokesperson Reann Mommsen confirmed to CNN. "That's the job of naval intelligence," said Thompson. "Watching an adversary is a daily effort."

And tunnels can make that frustrating for US military planners, said Carl Schuster, a former director of operations at the US Pacific Command's Joint Intelligence Center.

"You have no evidence of (the submarine's) combat readiness, operational response times and availability," he said. "Tunnels blind potential opponents to the submarines' operating status and patterns, denying them the ability to determine the state of China's military preparations, knowledge critical to assessing China's intentions and plans."

As for the submarine itself, if it is one a Type 093, it would be one of as many as six in the Chinese fleet, according to the nonprofit Nuclear Threat Initiative. The Type 093 comes in three versions and can be armed with torpedoes and cruise missiles.
